The themes will be integrated into a variety of key dimensions, namely: Student Success Innovations; Media, Art and Culture; and Alumni.

#### STUDENT SUCCESS INNOVATIONS

- T&L break-away presentations to be hosted by the Dean: T&L with the theme: "Promoting student success through Teaching and Learning Innovations: The role of higher education institutions", on 5-6 June 2014.
- Academic Success Week will be hosted by HEADS from 28 July to 1 August 2014.
- NMMU's CCD premier event will be a panel discussion, where invited keynote speakers will be requested to engage with students on questions relating to the theme of: "Critical reflections on student success and democratic citizenship in the post-school education and training sector." This event will be hosted by CIPSET on 1 August 2014 in collaboration with other key internal stakeholders. Delegates from post-school educational institutions in the Eastern Cape will be invited as well as members of the public.

#### MEDIA, ART AND CULTURE

- Beyers Naude Youth Dialogue (George Campus) on the topic "What are the views of George youth 20 years into our political democracy?" being hosted by CANRAD and Kagiso Trust.
- The Arts and Culture unit will be hosting an art exhibition, music celebration and drama production which reflect the key theme. The "Talking Heads"

silhouette project is an interactive interview-based approach that incorporates an artistic form of expression by employing silhouette images. The idea is to create fun by allowing viewers to connect the silhouette appearances and the body shapes to create an approximation of the actual image of the person. The silhouette feature-based approach is used for its artistic beauty and the fact that it provides a medium to interactively express views from a diverse range of NMMU employees (from the lowest to the highest level of ranking). The project will involve twenty (20) NMMU employees representing every level and division in various institutional faculties, department and units. All 20 subjects will complete one-on-one oral/written interviews designed to elicit subjects' interpretations of their own understanding of some of the themes emanating from NMMU Vision 2020 (such as, probing their understanding of what it means to be African) and other general themes around democracy.

- Questions for interviews include:
  - Africa Week: What does being African mean for you?
  - > Twenty years of democracy: In your view what has been the impact of democracy over the last twenty years?
  - **Beyers Naude**: What would Oom Bey have thought of our twenty years of democracy?
- A poetry book produced by the Arts and Culture, with the theme in 2014: "Madiba" will also be linked to the theme of Higher Education and 20 years of democracy.
- A Women's Day event will be hosted by the Campus Director of Missionvale together with SGD and SRC where the theme will be integrated.
- MCR has proposed that soapbox and blogs can be used to stimulate debate, and that three opinion pieces be published in the general media.
- Online Cellphone Initiative (OCI) where staff and students will be invited to submit cellphone video recordings sharing their views on the following question: "What does democracy mean to you?" The most meaningful contributions will be showcased at the premier event, "Critical reflections on student success and democratic citizenship in the post-school sector", and prizes sponsored by the University Shop will be awarded to random submissions (e.g. 1st, 50th, 100th, etc).
- Integrate Arts and Culture acts relating to the central theme "Higher Education: 20 years of Democracy" into events being hosted by student societies under the auspices of Student Governance and Development.

Stellenbosch University set aside 14 and 15 May for two days of Celebration of 20 years of Democracy and Freedom. The chosen theme is "20YD: The story continues" and will focus on the importance of storytelling and the existence of multiple and intergenerational perspectives both with regards to the history of democracy at our institution and more recent experiences of staff and students.

As the nation celebrates 20 years of democracy, CUT will take stock of its contribution to the higher education sector as a University of Technology. # ii. Serious Intellectual engagements:

During the course of the specified week, public lectures and discussions will focus on topical issues such as past injustices and how the new dispensation has paved a way for the transformation of the economic landscape. It will endeavour to properly reflect the demographics of the country and correct the wrongs imposed by Apartheid; contribution of higher education to the National Development Plan; and our justice system and the rights of South African citizens.

Key objectives are to strategically position CUT as an engaged university showcasing old and latest technologies in various areas of innovation that advance sustainable development initiatives; to create an important platform for CUT's partners to share their contributions to the "CUT Week".

The theme of the campaign will be "Transforming to promote new ideas, innovation and practices, challenging retrogressive practices and traditions and celebrating achievements through diversity" or CUT10+ on the cut-in-edge of democracy.
